Thank you for all the comments received over the last few weeks. The statutory consultation process to make the different proposals for **Dulwich Streetspace** begun on Thursday 21 October 2021.

There are five permanent schemes, and two trial schemes, of which the details and deadlines to send responses is set out below.

Note: the Melbourne Grove (north) and Grove Vale schemes are being introduced as new trial measures (implemented by way of Experimental Orders, or ETMOs, made under section 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984) which are separated and amended from the previous trials in these locations. Anyone wishing to object to the making of the permanent order/s or make any other representation regarding the scheme would have 6 months to do so, from the date the ETMO/s come into force (or, if the ETMO is varied by a subsequent order or modified, from the date that variation order or modification comes into force). To provide representations for these two trials, please follow the standard process as outlined below.
